Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Year 11 Mock Examinations – November 2025

I am writing to you in advance of our forthcoming mock examinations for our Year 11 students. These examinations will take place over from Monday 17th November to Thursday 27th November 2025. This will be a very important opportunity for our Year 11 students to sit exams in a formal environment and is a good rehearsal for their final GCSE exams this summer.

The mock exams will enable students to practise their revision techniques, and to better understand how to work effectively in timed exam conditions. They will also provide your child's teachers with a clear indication of where they may need additional support to be able to achieve their full potential during the summer 2026 exam period.

Revision

During the mock exam period, students will have revision lessons led by their subject teachers, or if they have finished the exams in that subject, they will be expected to revise for another subject in silence. They will need to come prepared with their Chromebooks and the resources they need.

Students will also have all the revision resources they need in each subject uploaded to their Google classroom. As the year progresses, there will be much more emphasis on revision techniques in Student Development Time, in assemblies and each individual subject's lessons. Preparation

As well as revision it is important that students:

- Have enough sleep the night before their exams
- Arrive for the examination at least 15 minutes before the start of the exam
- Are hydrated and have a good breakfast before coming to school. This will help with their concentration.

Attendance

Throughout the academic year we promote the importance of attendance to all of our students.

During the mock examination period it is critical that Year 11 students attend school on time each day.

Expectations

These mock exams will ensure that your child fully understands the formal examination regulations laid down by JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) who oversee all public examinations, and how GCSE exams will run at Gosford Hill School. They will follow the expectations of the national exam regulations which you can find outlined below:

- Students must remain in silence at all times in the examination hall, and must not attempt to communicate with any other student
- Students must not carry an electronic device - this includes mobile phones, headphones, and watches
- Students must only have a transparent water bottle or pencil case
- Students must leave all of their belongings in the designated area.

These are the basic expectations of the JCQ. Student misconduct during actual GCSE examinations rightly has to be reported to the examination boards, to preserve the integrity of national qualifications. Misconduct can lead to being disqualified and not receiving a grade. After half term you will receive further details about the exact timings of the school day during the exam period and all the organisational information which is important for the smooth running of exams. Thank you for your support. It is important that students experience the full formal exam conditions during these mock examinations, in order to develop their confidence and resilience so that they are fully prepared for their final exams in Summer 2026.
