Terms 3, 4 & 5 - The Externally Set Assignment (ESA 40% of GCSE grade)						
AQA (exam board) provide an Externally Set Assignment with 7 different starting points. Students select and respond to one starting point. The Externally Set Assignment provides students with the opportunity to demonstrate through an extended creative response, their ability to draw together different areas of knowledge, skills and understanding in response to their selected starting point. Component 2 must cover all assessment objectives and have evidence of drawing and written annotation. Externally Set Assignment is marked internally assessed and externally moderated.
